GENERAL OBJECTIVES	
OBJECTIVE 1	The aim of the course is to increase competence in the understanding of human sexuality. It covers the principles of diagnostic procedures and interventions towards a person with sexual problems, as well as acquiring knowledge and skills about treatment methods used in sexology. Participants will verify personal attitudes and false beliefs about sexuality. They will gain knowledge about the challenges and dilemmas faced by contemporary sexology.
OBJECTIVE 2	The aim of the course is to gain knowledge about control and fertility disorders, including diagnostic methods and multifaceted treatment.
