MAIN GOALS	
GOAL1:	Enabling students to apply in practice the previously acquired knowledge in the field of diagnosing the most common diseases encountered in the family doctor's office and planning the appropriate therapy
GOAL2:	Creating conditions for the acquisition and improvement of cognitive skills (interpretation of data, making medical decisions) and practical skills (performing simple diagnostic and therapeutic procedures)

SUMMATIVE (I & II)	<p>Assessment of knowledge including specialties covered by the Practical Clinical Training is carried out through the MCQ exam .This exam consists of 150 questions with 4 answer options, and one correct answer and covers the basics of all mandatory specialties included in Practical Clinical Training. The passing level is set at 55% of correct answers.</p> <p>The summative assessment of practical skills has a form of Objective Structured Clinical Exam, which consists of 10 stations, including two with double tasks. Each of the stations is assessed according to its own criteria, and passing the entire exam requires passing of at least 8 stations, with the absolute requirement to pass the station testing skills in ALS.</p>
