MAIN GOALS	
GOAL1:	Enabling students to apply in practice the previously acquired knowledge in the field of diagnosing the most common gynecological diseases and obstetrical problems and planning appropriate therapy
GOAL2:	Creating conditions for the acquisition and improvement of cognitive skills (interpretation of data, making medical decisions) and practical skills (performing simple diagnostic and therapeutic procedures)

CONDITIONS FOR COURSE COMPLETION	
	<p>The student is obliged to follow every day clinical duties, to implement the didactic plan recorded in the Student Diary of Clinical Training, practice the practical skills listed therein and diligently perform the tasks assigned to him. The student records the activities performed in the Diary, and the acquired skills are confirmed by the signature of the supervisor. The student is expected to demonstrate a proper attitude towards patients and their relatives, as well as proper cooperation with other members of the therapeutic team. Completion of the internship is confirmed by the direct supervisor's signature. The final credit is made by the person responsible for the course.</p>

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<b>METHODS OF ASSESMENT:</b>	
<b>IN TERMS OF KNOWLEDGE:</b>	The student's knowledge is checked on an ongoing basis during discussions with the direct supervisor of the practice
<b>IN TERMS OF SKILLS:</b>	Prolonged observation by the supervisor. OSCE exam at the end of the year.
<b>IN TERMS OF SOCIAL COMPETENCE:</b>	As above
<b>FORMATIVE:</b>	N.A.
<b>SUMMATIVE (I &amp; II)</b>	<p>Assessment of knowledge including specialties covered by the Practical Clinical Training is carried out through two consecutive theoretical exams: an MCQ exam and an oral exam.</p> <p>The MCQ exam consists of 150 questions with 4 answer options, and one correct answer and covers the basics of all mandatory specialties included in Practical Clinical Training. The passing level is set at 55% of correct answers.</p> <p>The oral exam consists of 5 questions and includes case studies in the field of internal medicine, pediatrics, surgery and gynecology with obstetrics. Answers to questions are scored on a scale of 0-3. The condition for passing the oral exam is obtaining at least 8 points.</p> <p>The summative assessment of practical skills has a form of Objective Structured Clinical Exam, which consists of 10 stations, including two with double tasks. Each of the stations is assessed according to its own criteria, and passing the entire exam requires passing of at least 8 stations, with the absolute requirement to pass the station testing skills in ALS.</p>
